Summer One-Day Workshop: **Planning for Post-COVID Ministry**

Tuesday, June 8, 2021

The workshop will combine discussion and presentation of up-to-date information about the Post-Covid Church. Registration Fee: \$20 per person, or \$15 per person for three or more from the same church.

Grants Available:

Congregational Assistance Fund

Last fall, ABC Ohio invited congregations from around the region to share their abundance with ABC Ohio churches that were struggling financially because of COVID. Congregations have given generously, so far more than \$20,000. **Grants** have been awarded to six congregations, but funds are still available to churches in need of assistance. COVID Relief Grants

Some of the grants they have considered are food ministries, child care assistance ministries, diaper ministries, and other means of supporting families in crisis because of COVID. 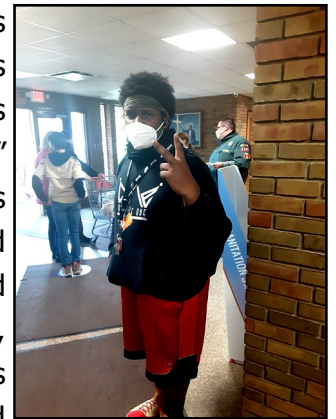

Just when you think it can't get any better, Easter was here—people wanted to Praise God because that Tomb was found empty. Jesus is Risen! An in-person worship service brought so many together that wonderful Sunday and, just to be inclusive to all, W.O.W. has resumed. You ask what is **W.O.W.? Worship on Wheels**—First Baptist's parking lot worship service each Sunday morning at 10:30 a.m. What took place in the fall

has resumed for all to attend in the present.

Who knew a church parking lot could be so useful? No longer is it sitting empty and on-hold, but there is more! Soon this lot will be smiling at the season's new community gardeners coming to tend their garden plots! God Revives Us, Again.

Another smile that has occurred at First Baptist Akron is from Laura Cosentino who oversees the Church's Food Pantry. There are many volunteers who help with the distributions. As Laura puts it, "we have had many church members, friends, and boy scouts put in many hours of hard work!" With that, a **"Volunteer of the Month"** program has been established and the first recipient is Quore Jackson.

Laura stated that April's honored volunteer "is always available at a moment's notice to help in any way." He has unloaded thousands of pounds of food, cleaned the pantry area, sorted donations, taken out trash, packed boxes, set up cones for directing traffic, filled



carts, loaded cars and much more! Quore has a heart for service and a wonderful attitude. Thank you to my right-hand man. I could not do this without you." Quore is a newly fifteen year-old young man whose parents just happen to be Pastor Paul and Jacque Jackson. On that bright sunny day, a crew of four of us headed down the road to Marysville Correctional Institution. For those who don't know, Marysville is one of two women's correctional facilities in the state. We were excited, as always to work, and represent the Lord in our service. This time it was different. Due to the State still being shut down, and due to Covid-19, we were only allowed to "deliver" the pre-Easter/Resurrection goodies.

It was an exciting time. As sad as this may sound, expecting mothers who are institutionalized are permitted, by the state, to carry, deliver and keep their children, on-sight, for three years. Initially the thought horrified me. Then instead of looking at the glass ½ full, I changed my perspective. In three years, the babe would certainly know "her/his mother." Her heartbeat, smile, temperament and so much more. Well, to make a long story short, BBI and

our collaborate partner delivered, on *Good Friday*, over 1200 infant to 3 years of age, baby items: from diapers, wipes, bottles, (pens, pencils and journals for the adults), socks, sandals and shoes.

It was indeed a Good Friday, and today, we are all the better blessed because of the Resurrection.

It seems like forever since I sat down to write about all that is happening at Koinonia Camp. It has been long enough that I could probably write ten pages and still not cover everything that has and is happening at camp. I am going to try and give you the highlights... and of course invite you to come see things for yourself.

Summer is just around the corner. A very close corner... much closer than seems possible. We are still accepting registrations but some individual camps are filling up fast. All of the new (last year) guidelines, regarding our allowed room occupancy, are lower than we like and therefore, camp sizes are limited. Hurry and register your camper(s) today.

Along the lines of summer camp, it is always good to put our theme out there for all to read. This year our theme is **"REVOLUTION"** and comes from the scripture reference listed above. You see when Jesus talked or taught it always turned the way people looked at things upside down and backward. If you look closely the word revolution has **U LOVE** right in the middle... if you read it from right to left. It is when we love one another that we show that we are disciples of Christ. We will be challenging campers this summer to show love to everyone.

In the fall of 2020, we were able to start a new ministry. Sounds crazy to begin a ministry in the middle of a pandemic, but I was losing my mind without campers. The ministry is named, **YAMs and Potatoes**. It is a time for young adults (18-30

years old) to come together. Thanks to ABC Ohio, and some other financial supporters, we have been able to have some wonderful activities. It was a group of high school students from Conneaut High School who helped plant. As we look to the next few weeks and planting, we hope to have beans, tomatoes, squash and peppers. But our biggest planting will be pumpkins!

Pumpkins are what began the **Koinonia Carnival** several years ago. And with a year off last year, I am anxious to put together an even bigger and better event in 2021. Mark your calendars for **October 9, 2021**. It will be a blowout event and if we are blessed with The Great Pumpkin harvest we hope for, we will be sending pumpkins home with everyone who attends. If you are sitting and thinking, how can I help make this happen ... GREAT... call the office and let us hook you up. We are going to need volunteers.

Did someone say volunteers? **S.W.A.T.** Saturdays are still happening the 3rd Saturday of every month. In April, we had thirty-five servants show up to work together to beautify the camp. There is never a time at the camp when there isn't something that needs to be done. We have projects at every skill level and age group. We need your help making the ministry happen. We meet at 9AM to begin work, then we have lunch at 12:30pm. In between, we serve together so that camp is ready for Changed Lives.

"Changed Lives" is our purpose at Koinonia Camp. And I have to admit that I am one of those changed lives. It has been over eighteen years since

The bottom of Hillside is going to become a place for our Maintenance Person to land while we look to build a new residence home on the grounds. After we build the new residence, Hillside will become a pastor getaway, director cabin and Air BNB. I am telling you this because we need more volunteers and donations to make this happen. If you would like to help in any way, please call the office (I bet you didn't see that coming – LOL). Seriously, I told you I have been at camp 18 years, I love what I do and cannot imagine doing anything else, but I am no spring chicken. Please, help make this happen so we can bring in younger help to keep the ministry happening.

Folks, I covet your prayers. As we enter the summer season, I simply ask for you to pray for the campers who are going to attend. Pray that they will experience Jesus. Pray for the Counselors, Directors and Staff who will be serving those campers. Pray that they would have the wisdom and energy to show Jesus to each camper. TRINITY BAPTIST CHURCH NEWS



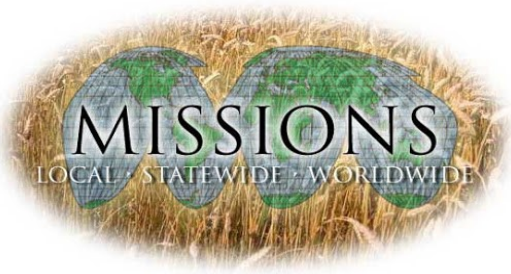

As of April, 2500 persons have been arrested and detained for political reasons as well as 800 persons who have been displaced from their homes. - American Baptist Women's Ministries are planning a virtual weekend on June eleventh and twelfth. There is going to be a Gala Night on Friday and three speakers on Saturday. It is a good time to get our ABC Girls together for fun, family and "ever encouraging faith." Check with your AB Women's Leader and stay "ever encouraged."
- There is a slogan going around due to the many maladies, killings and negative situations, namely, "We are better together." I think as believers, we especially embrace this thought,

and do whole heartedly agree, "We are better together." The genesis of the thought identifies racism and anti-racism. Praise God for ABC/USA and the establishment of the Anti-Racism Task force. This is another reason to be "ever encouraged."
