The workshop will take place on **Saturday, August 14** from 10 am to 3 pm. The event is open to pastors, church leaders, and others in your church family who serve as encouragers or ministry caregivers in your church or community. The event will be entirely virtual. The ZOOM meeting code will be sent to registrants

before the event. Rev. D. Scott Johnson is a retired pastor from the Market Street Baptist Church in Zanesville and has served more than three decades in local church ministry. Currently he serves as an Associate Regional Minister for the American Baptist Churches of Ohio, providing pastoral care to the pastors in the Zanesville Baptist Association. Scott has completed advanced studies in the field of Death and Grief and has taught college courses on these subjects. We are pleased to welcome Rev. Johnston as our presenter for the second One Day Workshop. Please complete the registration form for the event that has been sent to your church and mail it to the ABC Ohio office at 136 North Galway Drive, Granville, OH 43023 by **Wednesday, August 11**. Registration may also be made through the ABC Ohio website at abc-ohio.org. The cost of the event is \$25 for the first registrant from a church, \$20 for additional registrants from the same church, \$15 for Leadership Academy students.

This second half of the summer brings a wedding, a memorial luncheon, returning AA groups, a parking

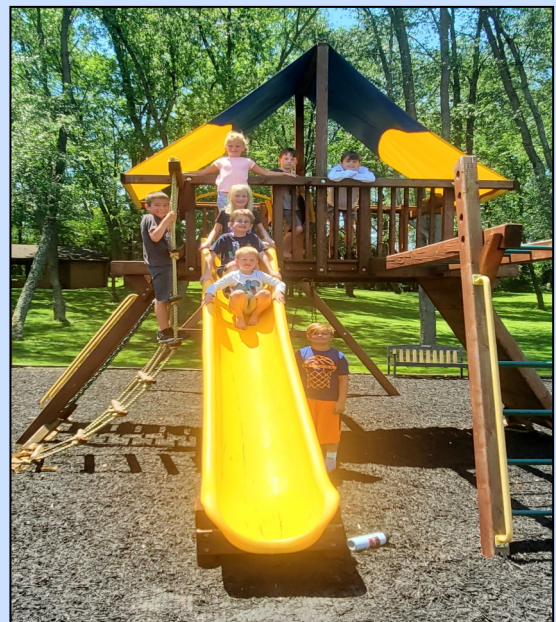

On Saturday, July 24th we participated in a Habitat For Humanity Build Day. We helped with siding at a home on Willet Avenue S.E. in Canton.

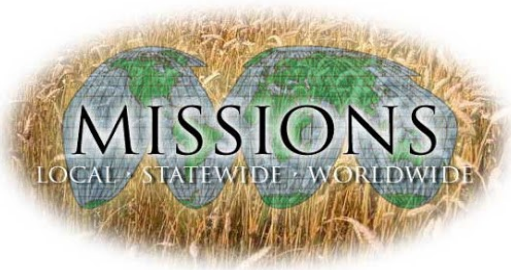

As we begin to return to some sense of normal, it is a great, tremendous blessing to know that our commissioned missionaries, ABC/USA, ABC/Ohio and our American Baptist associations have "contended for the faith" and "continue to do the work God has assigned to our hands."

Through prayers and gifts our missionaries, "Pete and Sarah McCurdy are sustained in Mexico City as the work in the Baptist Seminary is bearing fruit. "Peter and Sarah's hope is that through their ministries, hearts and minds will be changed and people will grow into the image of Christ."

A great entry into their hope is the American Baptist Home Mission Society and their building of a mission education program. A question that warrants critical thinking asks, "what kind of mission education will meet your needs?" As we think about pre and post-pandemic variants on the rise, racial tensions, political, social and cultural upheaval, "what kind of mission education will meet our needs?"

During the 2021 Biennial Mission Summit the answer to the above question began to raise the consciousness of the participants. The theme of the Summit was Imagine: Hope, Healing and Unity. It was a wonderful virtual experience. The Worship services were dynamic and the Summit Offerings were allocated to: 1) Humanitarian Aid for the people of Myanmar, 2) To Support Anti-Racism Work at the individual, congregational and institutional levels of ABC/USA, 3) Support scholarships for the 2022 ABC/USA Women in Ministry Conference.

The offering portal is open until 9/24/21 for any one, churches, ministries etc. to participate. The

entire experience was great!

Women in Ministry celebrated the June conference at Green Lake. Their theme is Radical, Redeemed and Ready. I am sure through the different workshops and the innovative worship services this was a tremendous blessing and charged every participant, especially women to "press toward the mark." Phil. 3:14.

Baptist World Alliance held their first virtual Baptist World Congress. It provided an opportunity for Baptists worldwide to stand together at this "critical" time. Dr. C. Jeff Woods attended and said, "I always appreciate how the diversity of God's people approach worship and the scriptures." To that, I say Amen!
